BUFFALO, N.Y. (WIVB) - A plea for help in getting Buffalo relief supplies to Haiti, has been answered.

The plea was made by the Buffalo Friends of Haiti Thursday, on News 4 at Noon.

Thursday we learned through a Facebook picture that Franck Desire had survived the earthquake in Port-Au-Prince, and was helping others try and get their lives together.

Franck has relatives here in Buffalo and Miami. He had visited more than a hundred schools, performing on the drums.

The group he founded in Buffalo, Asakivle Buffalo Friends of Haiti had collected more than a hundred boxes of relief items but had no one to ship them out until Dale Clear, a Kenmore firefighter from the 911 Foundation, volunteered to truck the items to New York City for shipment to Haiti.

Dale had seen the plea got out Thursday on News 4 at Noon.

Clear said, "Well I had some things that had to go to New York anyway, and when I saw the plight of the Friends of Haiti on television, I decided since I've got to go anyway, I might as well help them out."

"It's beautiful. It's absolutely beautiful. I'm not surprised. People here in Buffalo and western New York, they're just, I know them for their generosity now," said Sabine Van Wyck, of Asakivle Buffalo Friends of Haiti.

The 911 Foundation provides relief and material to third world countries.
